Rape Victim Advocates Confidential Advisor Training

The Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education Act recently passed in Illinois, detailing a number of expectations of higher education institutions in Illinois regarding various aspects of the sexual violence response on campus. Among the many provisions is a requirement that each institution identify one or more "Confidential Advisors" and that the identified Confidential Advisor receive 40 hours of specialized training, with the deadline for compliance being August 1, 2016.

Will you be in compliance?

In anticipation of this upcoming deadline and to assist area higher education institutions in ensuring compliance with the Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education Act, Rape Victim Advocates will be offering a 40 hour training specifically designed for Confidential Advisors in July 2016. Rape Victim Advocates (RVA) has an extensive history of working with higher education institutions, providing student support, policy consultation, technical assistance, training and prevention education to 13 Chicago area higher education institutions.
