## CONSEQUENCES OF FEDERAL FUNDING CUTS

2 full time advocates and 2 full time trauma therapist **positions eliminated** since FY23  
Satellite office in Ravenswood **permanently closed**  
24-hour services in the emergency room of 2 hospitals **suspended**  
Advocacy, trauma therapy and prevention education services **wait-listed for months**  
**Hundreds of sexual assault victims without help; thousands impacted**

## \$20 million

### Statewide Investment Needed in Sexual Assault Crisis Services

ICASA requests an investment of \$20 million in General Revenue Funding line item for sexual assault victims and prevention activity statewide. This is an increase of \$12 million from current funding. This investment would be an average of \$943 per survivor served by rape crisis centers in FY23.
